



Just in case you forget, we will be advertising on social media as well as around the village to remind you to get your entries ready for the big day.



Sawtry WI 100 Years On

The Women's Institute organisation was started in Canada in 1897. Its purpose was to enable women in rural areas to advance their education, and make an impact on their communities. The first WI in the United Kingdom met in North Wales in 1915.

In 1919 a group of like-minded women decided to start a branch in Sawtry. In July they had their first meeting at the Working Men's Club in Gidding Road. Word spread and by 1922 there were 88 members on the register and an annual subscription of 2/- (10p) was paid. The ladies all wore hats both indoor and out and you touched the teapot at your peril.

During the war years the members worked very hard for the war effort. In 1940 they helped with the Federation jam making scheme when 5,000 lbs of jam was made. Sawtry's share of the profits was £22.00 which was shared between Peterborough and Huntingdon hospitals and other organisations in the village. £22 went a lot further in those days! The ladies knitted socks and helped in any way they could in village life.

After the war the meetings flourished. Singing and Drama was one of Sawtry WI 's special interests and competitions were entered and prizes won. The highlight of the year was the annual outing to either London to see a show or the seaside and a Christmas party was held for the members and the children of the village.

In 1955 it was decided to purchase the Amicable Hall in Gidding Road for princely sum of £225.66s. It was a very basic single brick building with very few 'mod cons'. Over time improvements were made and then in 2002 a big campaign was launched to completely re-furbish the Hall. After much fundraising and a few very welcome grants, the project was finally completed in 2017 when new drains were installed. The Hall is now a welcoming modernised building that is enjoyed by all.

Our membership remains steady and our monthly meetings are well attended. We have guest speakers who give us a variety of talks and we always enjoy delicious refreshments, a raffle and social time. We welcome visitors and love it when new members join us. we support all the National Campaigns and are very concerned with all the issues that affect the quality of life in the environment. Being part of such a large and growing organisation means we can make our voices heard and really make a difference.

So much has changed in the last 100 years, technology for one, but some things perhaps the most important, do not. Our Knit & Knatter and Patchwork & Quilting Groups support Hinchingbrooke Hospital and other organisations. They make bonnets for premature babies, comfort blankets, twiddle muffs for dementia patients and squares to be made into blankets for overseas projects. This is to name but a few. Many of our members are involved with other groups in the village, doing what they can to be of service. The Ladies no longer wear hats at meetings and we have a rota to handle the teapot, but the friendship and fun we share together, is as strong now as it was in 1919. Sawtry WI may be 100 years old but we are young in spirit and that I am sure will continue into the next century.

Huntingdonshire History Festival

The events begin in Huntingdon on 29 June with the Opening Ceremony, a Mediaeval Re-enactment, Georgia Manning's children's workshop and a Civil War and armour exhibition in the Cromwell Museum.

Using the stage area of the Sawtry Club we were able to produce sinister looking portraits of volunteer members with backgrounds painted in light using light wands of various patterns. Dan set up a water filled wine glass and the splashes created by dropping a lemon slice into it were captured using the high speed flash illumination and Andy set up a light box to capture images of fruit slices by transmitted light showing the structure of the fruit.

In April we had a Portraiture Evening. Our thanks go to Andy, Dan and Mark for setting it up but it would all have been for nothing without our wonderful model Tracey Cheung, thanks very much Tracey.

In April the subject, presented by the Great Fen Project on a return visit, was the *Spitfire Dig*, which mainly consisted of a film made during the excavation of the Mk 1 Spitfire X45933. This was piloted by Harold Edwin Penketh of 266 Rhodesian Squadron Royal Airforce base at RAF Whittering.

The excavation was carried out by Oxford Archaeology East Project, joined by personal of the Defense Archeology Group who oversee Operation Nightingale, a growing breaking initiative to aid the recovery of service personnel injured during their military service, aviation archaeology experts from Historic England and lastly Great Fen staff and volunteers. The dig was funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund. The artefacts found remain the property of the MOD and will be retained by the RAF Wyton Pathfinder Museum.

SAWTRY HISTORY THEN & NOW

The last of our ongoing series on stories from Sawtry's past

Centenary of Peace Day - 19 July 1919

The cease fire on 11 November 1918 did not totally end World War I, in fact Treaty negotiations at Versailles lasted long into 1919. A Peace Committee was formed and met on 9 May 1919 arranging four days of celebrations of peace festivities.

Saturday 19 July 1919 saw the start of these celebrations with King George V issuing a message to wounded soldiers. Thousands of people flocked to London for a huge parade. Not all were happy and rioters burned down Luton Town Hall as the men were coming home to no jobs.

Sawtry of course had its own celebrations, the Boys Scouts held a morning parade behind the School Hall with Colonel Cavendish in attendance from Whitehall convalescent home, Coppingford. The men, possibly ex-soldiers, had a tea party in the School Hall around 4.00pm. On the Green there was a big party for everybody, dancing round an old upright piano supervised by the women of the village. An effigy of the Kaiser was burnt on a bonfire, just like Guy Fawkes.



Changing Attitudes by Education

Local Traffic Officers have attended three fatal road traffic collisions in recent weeks. The collisions have been different in terms of causation, class of road, road conditions and vehicle types but the overriding theme has, however, been driver error. Fatal casualty rates have fallen steadily over the last seven years but have now levelled off and appear to be going back up. Fatal collisions have reduced due to improvements in road engineering, vehicle technology (ie air bags etc.), rapid medical intervention (ie air ambulance) to name but a few. Improvements in driving or riding standards do not feature in the list. An increase in poor driver behaviour, poor decision making and increased risk taking is bubbling to the surface and the number of fatal collisions appear to be on the increase.

Improving your standard of driving is not difficult, it just needs a bit of commitment on your part and input from one of our Tutors. Some people feel, initially, that approaching us is embarrassing and an admission of failure whereas in fact it is quite the reverse. An application for membership is a demonstration that you wish to move your driving (or riding) skills to a higher level and reduce the chances of you being involved in a collision. Advanced drivers and riders can avoid collisions by seeing circumstances developing that could result in a collision but having enough time to take the appropriate action to avoid the collision. Often, other parties in the potential collision have no idea that your actions have avoided a collision. You, however, have the satisfaction of knowing that your improved skills have kept you, and your passengers, safe from injury or even death.

AN EYE ON NATURE



Spring is breeding time and dunnocks have a love life rivalling any good soap opera. The alpha male displays by shuffling its wings dancing through bushes and hedgerows. It tries to look as impressive as possible to any female in its patch. Unfortunately, even if our top male secures a 'wife', he is often undone by other males waiting for an opportunity to have an affair with his females who are more than happy to nip off when his guard is down.

Dunnocks co-exist with our iconic garden bird, the robin. Being similar in size and build, dunnocks are seen as a rival and are often bullied. It is all part of being the bird which is so familiar yet ignored, going about their lives and keeping a low profile. Now, go out and look for one in your garden, I bet you are playing host to our little brown bird.
