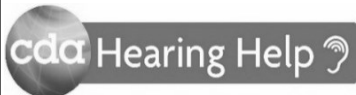

HOLME VILLAGE COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

Well, our 2 months of low traffic volume have now ended, and we are back to the normal mayhem and a big call for more speedwatch sessions to try and control the through traffic.

Our hit rate during the quiet period was still 10% with one vehicle going at 59 mph as it approached the corner of Church Street and Station Road. It wasn't the first time that one had been caught either.

I was approached by a potential volunteer recently who said she had been sending emails to register her interest, but they kept bouncing back so I have changed the contact email address. As always, we are trying to recruit further volunteers to support our campaign. THE LITTLE GIDDING PILGRIMAGE: SATURDAY 16 MAY: ALL WELCOME!

As many readers of the 'Sawtry Eye' will know, Little Gidding was made famous in the twentieth century through T S Eliot's last great poem, written when he was a fire warden during the Blitz, in 1942.

Eliot was involved with the first 'Friends of Little Gidding', which was responsible for early versions of the Pilgrimage beginning in the 1940s. My parents first took me in 1958 I believe, when the format was simply a picnic in the field followed by a procession into the church. The fences were different then and Ferrar House was still the home at the heart of a working farm.

Things changed in the 1970s when Tony and Judith Hodgson bought the farmhouse and outbuildings and started a community echoing that of the Ferrars which began in 1625 with the widowed Mary Ferrar's purchase of the Manor and the move there of her entire domestic coterie. Her son Nicholas developed the religious regime they followed. I was told that this was the first time anyone had attempted to live a communal devotional life after the dissolution of the monasteries under Henry VIII, and it inspired people.

As in the seventeenth century, so in the twentieth, there was turbulence, but the thread of Pilgrimage and the interest of the wider world remained.

Leighton Bromswold was George Herbert's church. He was a friend of Nicholas Ferrar's. When George Herbert was dying, he sent his poems to Nicholas asking that he publish them if he thought them any good or burn them if he didn't. Thanks to Nicholas's publishing of 'The Temple' we still have many of our favourite hymns. George Herbert also asked the Ferrars to take care of some building work at Leighton Bromswold. The works took place under John's supervision, following the death of Nicholas, and are still in evidence there.

These days the Pilgrimage is a gentle walk of about 5 miles, with pauses known as 'stations' for talks and reflections along the route. We begin and end with a church service, at Leighton Bromswold and Little Gidding respectively.

Other components are lunch, tea, companionship, fresh air and exercise. What's not to like?

Sawtry Parish Council considers requests for grants, under Section 137 of the Local Government Act 1972, twice yearly in April and September. Applicants will be requested to complete an application form and return it to the Clerk by a given date. All applicants will be contacted following the Parish Council's decision.

Grants are made to voluntary, not for profit, organisations that are set up and run by a voluntary, unpaid management committee.

Information for applicants:

- Grants are only made to groups meeting the needs of Sawtry residents
- Grants are made for an identified project
- Accumulated reserves will be considered when the level of grant is considered
- Grants must be spent within the current financial year or returned to the Parish Council
- Grants cannot be made to cover money already spent
- Grants will not be given to groups which operate for private gain
- If the organisation closes, grant aid that is not spent is expected to be returned
- Grants will not be made to individuals from this fund
- Applications from regional groups will not be considered unless they provide a specific identifiable service to the residents of Sawtry
- The Parish Council sets its grant budget annually as part of the general budget setting process
- Outside funding should be sought in addition to approaching the Parish Council

Applicants are required to:

- Ensure sufficient levels of administration, hold regular meetings, keep minutes and circulate information to group members
- Keep proper accounts – a copy to be submitted with the application form
- Be open to eligible users, as defined by the group's constitution
- Establish and monitor equal opportunity policies and practices
- Report back to the Parish Council on the progress of the project
- Acknowledge the Parish Council support in Annual Reports

CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

Get your chimney swept and keep your home fire safe!

The Service attends around 100 fires a year involving chimneys, most of which could be avoided by following some simple safety tips:

- Appoint a skilled and technically competent chimney engineer. To find your nearest local HETAS Approved Chimney Sweep visit: <https://www.hetas.co.uk/consumer/services/chimney-sweeps/>
- Keep the flue shafts clear and ensure they are well maintained
- Only use properly treated wood to build a fire
- Always use a fireguard to protect against flying sparks from hot embers
- Make sure embers are properly put out before you go to bed.

We always advise getting your chimney swept at least once a year, preferably before lighting it for the first time when the cold weather arrives. There could be a buildup of debris that's accumulated over the year, which can be set alight when heating the home and could cause a significant fire.

Some will also be looking at using a chimney for the first time, that may not have been used for many years. It is really important to make sure it is swept and inspect the brickwork before lighting it for the first time.



AN EYE ON NATURE

UK wildlife is disappearing fast! I'm not just being an alarmist. It really is.

Very few species are maintaining their numbers of 50 or so years ago. In my lifetime I have noticed the dramatic contrast. My great niece won't know what she has missed. But all is not lost, I have a 10-point plan which will make an enormous difference if many of us adopt it. I know what a dramatic difference it made to my little garden. So, here it is...

- 1) In 'no mow May' resist touching the mower. Trust me it will make a big difference by the 31 May as the wildflowers which hung on, will be able to flower and provide nectar for starving insects.
- 2) Grow flowering plants for nectar, choosing wild or cultivated species so that there is a constant supply from March to September (even October in a hot year). Bumblebees and overwintering butterflies are on the wing in March. Then in Autumn a fresh hatch of butterflies need nectar to feed up prior to hibernating in your potting shed or garage.
- 3) Resist any hedge or shrub pruning from March to August. Our garden birds now have a very long nesting season.
- 4) As I have previously written about, hedgehogs are in great peril and if we don't help them now, they will be gone forever. A simple but very effective way to help is to create a 'Hedgehog Highway'. Fences are an impenetrable barrier to potentially great gardens. In our close there are hedgehog underpasses and little arch ways between us. It is so rewarding watching 'our hogs' going from garden to garden in the evening. Why not go, all out, and create accommodation. My low spreading shrub is a year long refuge for hibernation and summer 'bedroom', I also have a small purpose-built hedgehog house for daytime sleeping through the summer, this kept my hogs very happy in 2025.
- 5) Phew, our summers are so hot now and it can be weeks between rain fall. Please put out fresh water in a shallow dish on the ground and a bird bath at a high level. This will keep everyone happy.
- 6) Where there is space to grow shrubs or small trees choose varieties which have abundant Cherries, Rowen, Hawthorn or Crabapple are great as so too is Ivy, if allowed to flower and set berry. These will feed our blackbirds, thrushes and any winter visitors in harsh weather.
- 7) Places in our modern world for nesting birds are at a premium. I have a range of nest boxes for garden birds and the swifts to use come May. They were all occupied last year and my bigger shrubs for blackbirds and pigeon nests.
- 8) Do consider a garden pond. It can be surprisingly small and still be a magnet for frogs, newts and dragonflies as long as the wildlife can get in and out of the pond it will work, trust me!
- 9) We have over 270 species of bee living in the UK. Providing a bee house for them or a little bare ground in a sunny spot will give several species a home. I hosted tree bees in my soffits in 2022, what an honour!
- 10) Finally, come autumn this year resist at all costs the bigger autumn tidy up. Our wildlife relies on a garden full of habitats to hibernate in. Giving the garden over to wildlife until late winter/early spring will pay rich dividends, so there it is, for what its worth. Anything that gives wildlife a helping hand will pay handsome dividends and ensure that the future generations will see our wonderful wildlife. Our gardens are a last refuge for many wildlife species in the UK and having a garden of wild 'neighbours' gives me great joy, I hope it can for you too.

COUNCILLOR'S UPDATE FOR SAWTRY, STILTON AND SURROUNDING VILLAGES

I've lived in Sawtry for over 27 years, and I've never known our local roads to be in such a poor state. As someone who rides both push bikes and motorcycles, I see the condition of our roads up close and it's simply not good enough.

As your local councillor, I now spend every single day, (yes weekends included) replying to pothole emails and chasing Highways about poor repairs, failed repairs, and contractors who appear completely unbothered by the quality of their work. There is only so much I can do, but the waste in this system is, at best, scandalous and, at worst, negligent.

We're seeing widespread problems across large areas: Gidding Road, Archers Wood, Deer Park, Fen Lane, Norman's Cross and many other roads in the villages. It's not one street, it's everywhere. I have engaged Highways on all of these matters and will continue to press for action.

Ranting on social media might let off steam and I understand the frustration, but it won't trigger a repair. Every official report matters. It keeps pressure on the County Council and strengthens my hand when I challenge them on your behalf.

Responsibility for Highways sits with Cllr Alex Beckett, Chairman of Highways, and we are constantly being told by him and the Leader of the Council, Cllr Lucy Nethsingha, that "more is being spent." But spending more doesn't mean much if it's still being wasted on poor and failed repairs. Quality matters.

Finally, I will be standing for re-election alongside my great Colleague Ross Martin in the HDC May elections. With Local Government Reorganisation ahead, there has never been a more important time for us all locally. Given the significance of these changes, we need experienced councillors who are prepared to challenge and see this through for our community.

Thank you for your continued support, it truly makes a difference.

We deserve better roads. Let's keep the pressure on.

PILGRIMAGE

Dear Friends,

I wonder what you enjoy watching on television? One of the programmes I look forward to is 'Pilgrimage' which involves celebrities from a variety of contexts trekking together, sharing life and faith on the way.

The programme points to a reality - in a busy world, an increasing number of people are rediscovering the quiet gift of pilgrimage. At its heart, a pilgrimage is simply a journey taken with intention, usually involving movement both visible and within a person's heart and spirit. It is about nurturing awareness of others, self, and for some, God. It is the journey that is significant as opposed to the destination.

The Bible often describes faith as a journey. In Psalm 84:5 we read: 'Blessed are those whose strength is in you, whose hearts are set on pilgrimage.' This verse reminds us that when we set out with God in mind, the journey itself can shape and strengthen us.

Throughout history Christians have found that walking helps create space for reflection and prayer. The writer John Bunyan, author of *The Pilgrim's Progress*, described the Christian life itself as a pilgrimage - a path filled with challenges, companions, and moments of grace along the way.

I value the insight too in the following story involving a traveller who met a monk returning from a pilgrimage. 'What did you gain from your journey?' the traveller asked. The monk replied, 'I lost many things - my hurry, my worry, and my need to rush ahead.' In losing those things, the monk discovered peace.

Pilgrimage does not always mean travelling far. Sometimes it can be as simple as walking slowly through familiar countryside with open eyes and a listening heart - noticing birdsong, trees, and the quiet beauty of creation - each signpost to the Creator. In fact, on Saturday 2 May there will be an opportunity to join a mindful nature walk from Over Methodist Church (a poster with full details is on page 8).

As Easter approaches, Christians remember the journey Jesus took through suffering and death to new life. After the first Easter, two disciples discovered the risen Christ walking beside them on the road to Emmaus. Perhaps pilgrimage still begins the same way - with a simple walk together, one brave step at a time.

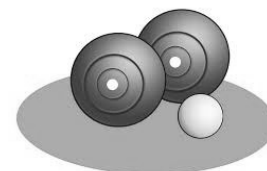

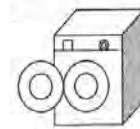

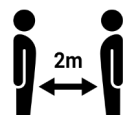
