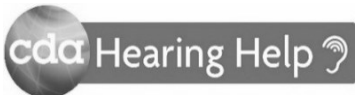

HOLME COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

The number of vehicles passing through the village on the B660 just recently has been much lower than we have experienced for some time. This is great news for everyone but unfortunately approximately 10% of them are still exceeding the speed limit so speedwatch is still a necessity.

One of our volunteers felt the urge to join us after her young niece was knocked down by a car which was travelling at 30mph - she was not seriously injured but everyone realised if the car had been exceeding the speed limit it would have been much more serious. That volunteer thought it was worth the effort to join us to try and save other people from serious injury.

If you are recorded by the speedwatch team you will receive a letter from Cambridgeshire Police pointing it out and asking you to be more considerate and not do it again. Those who are recorded twice will get another, more strongly worded letter and a third time will result in a personal visit from a uniformed officer who will issue a verbal warning and could ask to check your vehicle documents. Ideally don't exceed the speed limit and avoid all three events.

HOLME YOUTH CLUB

Another holiday is upon us and then we move into the final half term of this year. Unfortunately, although we currently have 40 members on role, attendance has dropped quite dramatically since Easter with less than 10 members attending for a couple of weeks (not even enough to pay the rent for the hall). I understand there has been a lot on with school and family commitments, but it does mean our funds are running low so we may not be able to put on a subsidised day out this term. If there is a demand for a visit, we will arrange something but cannot offer any funding I'm afraid.

With the lovely weather we have been having we have made use of the school field each week and it's great to see the members having fun in the open air - it's a lot quieter for the supervisors too!

We will shortly be sending out the invitation to the Year 4s to come and join us for a taster so we can estimate the demand for next year.

Holme Youth Club membership is open to school years 5-10 who live in Holme or attend or have attended Holme (CofE) Academy. We meet in the village hall from 6.30-8.30 on term time Fridays offering a variety of play equipment, table tennis, air hockey, PS4, etc and during the summer term if the weather is nice we go down to the school field (thanks to the school for allowing us to do this) where football, cricket, etc are on offer.

We have a subsidised tuck shop offering a variety of sweet and savoury treats and drinks.

Admission is £2 and some spending money for the tuck shop if you wish. We do rely on volunteers to supervise the sessions (one session each half term) and are very fortunate to have junior volunteers (ex-members who are now too old for membership) who man the tuck shop for us.

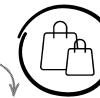

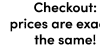

The T.S. Eliot Festival at Little Gidding is back again this year on **Sunday 5 July** with another exciting line-up providing an inspirational day of talks, readings, and discussions near the pig-sty, the dull façade, and the tombstone made famous by T.S. Eliot's poem.

This year's lineup includes the past president of the International T. S. Eliot Society, **Jayme Stayer**; prize-winning poet **Hannah Sullivan**; the presenters of the podcast Close Readings, **Seamus Perry** and **Mark Ford**; former Old Bailey judge **Charles Wide**.

Jayme Stayer will deliver this year's Little Gidding Lecture. The title is 'Unitarian, Puritan, Calvinist, Jansenist, Atheist: The Reverend Mr. Eliot's Erstwhile Heresies.' Professor Stayer is the author of *Becoming T.S. Eliot: The Rhetoric of Voice and Audience in Inventions of the March Hare*.

AN EYE ON NATURE

I grew up with a passionate love for all wildlife which will not surprise my regular readers.

Snakes evoke an instant reaction and sadly not always a good one. Stay with me because I hope to change your opinion if I can. There are the usual myths surrounding our only venomous snake, the Adder. They are indeed myths as their venom is very precious to them and they won't waste it on us as they can't eat us! If and it's a very very remote chance that you get bitten, it is a bit painful but, usually, that is all. Adders are very shy and will be long gone before their ever seen. Believe me, it is vital to be very quiet and gentle footfall is essential. The only way I ever see them is by being what I'm usually not, quiet and stealthy. The snake species most commonly encountered is the grass snake which was my first snake encounter as a teenager. As a frequent grass snake habitat – water and woodland glades, my 'hit rate' is quite high. Wow, do grass snakes swim well. I have seen them motor across a pond, dive for prey and terrorise newts. All very exciting stuff and the newts did escape capture.

There is one other species I have not yet mentioned, the smooth snake. They are super rare and live on Southern Heathland. The only snake which lives in the Sawtry area is our grass snake. As I have said, they are completely harmless to us. Their diet includes frogs, newts, small rodents and baby birds nesting on the ground or in low vegetation. As we know from bitter experience all our snakes are under great threat from development, habitat loss and wildfires. Adders and smooth snakes are particularly vulnerable to climate change which has dramatically increased the number of wildfires. Populations can be wiped out in a single fire causing local extinction. So please be kind to snakes as any encounter is a real privilege these days and they are far more frightened of us than we need to be of them.

Woodwalton Marsh and Gamsey Wood

The Huntingdonshire Local Group of the Wildlife Trust is pleased to invite you to visit these two small nature reserves. Both sites are managed by the Wildlife Trust and our leader will be Eamonn Lawlor.

Woodwalton Marsh is a rare example of a meadow on calcareous clay. It is an SSSI and has some interesting species such as Dropwort, Pyramidal Orchids and Suphur Clover. Butterflies, including marbled white, grizzled skipper and ringlet may also be seen.

Gamsey Wood is a County Wildlife Site and is believed to be part of the larger ancient forest that covered this area in Saxon times.

Both sites have limited parking, so please car share if possible. Either park in Woodwalton village and walk to the reserve entrance (Grid ref TL211814, what3words.com/sizing.companies.wing), or you can find a few spaces along this minor road which leads from Woodwalton village to Church End.

Booking is essential for these walks as both sites are small and numbers limited.

Breast Symptoms – Self Referral Service Now Open

Patients over 30 who are NOT pregnant with worrying breast cancer symptoms can now access specialist clinics in hospital without the need to attend a GP appointment.



The new self-referral service is available via NHS 111 online or the NHS App.

The service offers eligible patients' faster access to diagnostic care as it means they do not need to wait for a GP appointment and subsequent hospital referral.

Patients complete an online symptom assessment via NHS 111 online. Those who meet the eligibility criteria are offered direct self-referral to the specialist breast service at Addenbrooke's, Peterborough City or Hinchingbrooke Hospitals.

Those who do not meet the criteria are provided with advice and signposted to alternative services that can help with their symptoms.

To access the new breast referral service, patients can visit NHS 111 at <https://111.nhs.uk/>

Ladies under 30, those that are pregnant, men, and anyone else with breast symptoms who prefers to see a doctor first, can still book an appointment with a GP.

We hope that patients will find this new service to be beneficial.

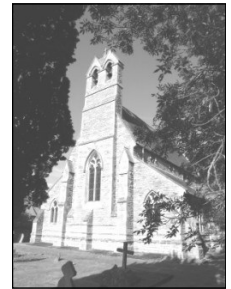

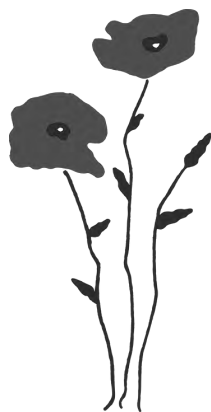

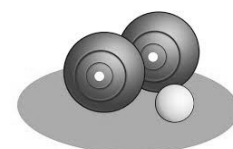

With no less than 20 teams, including 3 girls teams this year, it has been a busy time at Greenfield and Sawtry Junior School on the grass and on the excellent and well used 3g pitch at Sawtry VA where weekly training sessions have also been taking place for most of the teams. Weather-wise it has been a fairly mild and dry (ish) season, so the pitches have been well used by all those teams.

Here's a look as to how some of the older teams have fared this season.

The oldest team, the U18s, took 'til April to pick up their first league win after losing by the odd goal on no less than 5 occasions prior to that. They have made up for lost time and, with one match remaining (their final ever match as a team), they are currently on a four-match unbeaten run with 3 victories to their name. They will finish 9th in their ten-team league in what has been a very competitive last season of youth football.

The U16s finished 7th in their 10-team league with 5 victories in the league. This will also be their last year as a team, and they finished it off losing in the League Shield final going down 3-1 to old rivals Hampton.

The U15s, with one match still to play, will finish either 4th or 5th in their 11-team league. To date they have a record of 12 wins, 1 draw and 6 defeats. They had a good cup run, losing in the semis to eventual winners Isleham and also reached the 4th round of the County Cup losing out to St Neots.

The U14s, in the Peterborough League this year, finished 8th out of 9 teams. They won 4 matches, drew 4 and suffered 8 defeats. A first-round loss in the cup was bettered by a 3rd round loss in the county cup.

The U14 Falcons finished 4th (out of 11) teams with 11 wins to their name in the Cambridge Girls League. They also suffered a second-round exit in the league cup. The highlight though was a county cup final loss, 2-0 against St Ives, after a nail-biting penalty shoot-out win in the semi-final against Ramsey.

The U13 Yellows finished 5th in their 10-team league winning 8 of their 18 matches and went out in the 2nd round of the County cup. The U13 Blues had an excellent season in the Cambridge league finishing 2nd, winning 16 of their 22 matches and earning an impressive 51 points. They exited the league cup in the 3rd round getting knocked out by Linton. A penalty shoot-out win against Huntingdon in the County Cup led to a 3rd round exit for the team.

The U12 Blues, competing in the Cambridge league this season, won 7 of their 9 matches to finish second in their league in the 1st half of the season. A new league was then formed for the second half, and they went one better by winning that with 7 wins and 2 draws, they had a good run in the County Cup eventually going down in the quarter finals to Buckden. Even better, they have a league cup final to look forward to against Mildenhall - good luck with that.

The U12 Yellows, also in the Cambridge league this season, finished 7th in their 9-team league winning 2 matches in the 1st half of the season. In the second half they won 5 of their 9 matches to finish 3rd in the league. They lost in the 1st round of the County cup to St Neots.

The U12 Falcons, in their first season, have had some impressive wins as they notched up 16 in their first 21 matches. With one league match remaining they will end up 2nd in the league which is a fantastic achievement. They exited the league cup in the second round and lost in penalties in the County cup quarter finals to Ramsey.

So, a few good league and cup performances from the older sides this season and an especially promising start to competitive football for the U12 Falcons. Attention now switches to the annual Sawtry tournament over at Greenfield on the weekend of 27/28 June - fingers crossed for some good, but not too hot, weather - have a wander over if you want to see some good football.

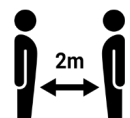
